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EDITORIAL



I do not want to exaggerate by showing others the ever-smiling face of mine; I do not want to appear in the formal dress, putting perfumes, catching my SEMSONITE full of official papers, full of catalogues that we have done during the last eight years of our existence.

Showing others our achievements, articles written in the papers about us, discussion that we raise in the cultural life. I do not want to show the relevant and irrelevant people our products; briefly I do not want to market myself as other managers do, because as I mentioned many times that our message is different.

As preferred, this project of EU-MAN is a cultural one, it is not a commercial one, and of course I do not want to appear in the rebel form as well, I mean the bohemian artists that we witness during the sixties and the early seventies of the last century. We are living in a different age, art and artists forced to circle in the axis as business people and other types.

When a person sees a very postmodern artist like Jeff Koons, should think about the end of the history of culture. I do not want to discuss this now, because I will come to this point on the article exhibition review later, but what I want to say it might be a shock to whom who dose not expect that I write something like this.

Perhaps some one will ask many question, how I dear to write about a respected well-known artist like this? How I can write and I am a responsible about an organization that must be polite and to some extant doing politic to keep some profile that might suit the politic of the funding land. An organization which always becoming huger and huger of responsibilities to many people despite it was on my personal only.

I have to admit that I reached to some stony point, which I cannot develop the qualitative work of the organization. The problem as I see is in me, my way thinking, I reached to that point that we in the EU-MAN are not doing more than the routine work which make exhibitions, publishing and speeding the magazine and participating to some conferences and seminars.

One might say, what do you want and you done all these activities? My answer defiantly will be, creating a new cultural habit is not a routine matter, it is forever research, it is not creating occasions.

I simply want to continue my project that I started eight years ago; I am defending the identity of the migrant art, what I call it, and what I start eight years ago to put the characteristics of the third culture as I called it.

This can be only by studding, researching and other follow-ups, creating dialogue, not by creating material. I confess that media is the most important part of the work, but, the cultural work has its strong messages as I imagined eight years ago, it needs a lot to know, a lot to do, and what lead me to the traditions is many reasons I can discuss them with others but I suppose that others understand me.




Ali is one of the bravest Arab artists who have worked with performances, conceptual art and contemporary works of art.


"Ali is a researcher more than he is an artist"

He was very fascinated with nature, not from the environmental aspect, but for the purpose of forming a relationship with the essence of nature. Searching deep inside himself for the soul and the silence that is so hard to find.

ART & NATURE are both an ideology and an art project. It began in 1967 after years of searching for and




discovering the common threads that bind art and nature together. The project analyses the laws of nature and their application and reflection in the works of art - conveying the laws of nature to art and affirming their existence. It is based on the ideology that constitutes the basis and the template for the above project. Art is the medium through which an artist empowers the spectator; his beliefs will be passed on and project its force.

My personal relationship with him I can express as an artistic experience, experience with an artist who is a rich and natural soul, good and generous like nature itself. He does not want to cause trouble to others. The same applies to his works of art. They are aesthetic works that wish to give something to the spectator at the same time as perhaps relieving the spectator of wrong notions he might nourish.

His primitive figures, whether they are human beings or animals or other things, make you feel that you have returned to nature or to the first nostalgic feeling of the womb. His works remind me of the novelist Emile Zola or of all the other writers and intellectuals who have invited us to return to Mother Nature.



Many questions were discussed between us about important issues, but as usual most of the questions were about our existence, our lives as artists in Europe. I found Ali to be the same as he has always been; nothing has changed him, he answers in the same spirit, has the same ideas, so I became eager to know more about him and about how he thinks of this world, because I find that Ali's opinion is always important and worth listening to, especially the opinions that concern art and life in Europe.

Art is a huge responsibility, art is an investment of the power of mankind, and the message of art is to educate people, to instil moral and good behaviour; but is it the responsibility of the individual or of society? I think it is the responsibility of both. The artist has conscience, but he is no better or worse than other people. It is God who creates us as human beings, and endows us with talents.

Ali is so full of knowledge, so full of ideas that I sometimes find it hard to follow him when he shares his thoughts with me and tells me about his ideas. Each sentence contains a new idea, and is an invitation to start thinking oneself. He has inspired me to think in depth, something I have rarely experienced with others.





The picture should impart a talent of meditation in the spectator. This I believe is the obligation of art. Pictures should impart feelings and a message at the same time. Only then can they inspire the talent of meditation, and if you ask me why man needs this talent, I will say that it enables him to make decisions. This I think is one of the greatest aims of mankind on this earth.

Ali has a deep feeling of universality, even in his behaviour. He is one of the rare artists whom I have met in my life whose thinking and behaviour is in natural harmony.

I do not feel that I am forced to live in a particular country, such as Finland or Egypt or anywhere else in this world, simply because this world is mine, I am a son of the world, I belong to it, what else is there to say?

Ali is multi-faceted person. He is meditative and always optimistic, because he knows what he wishes of this life; his involvement in art gave him a belief in and understanding of life in the deep and heartfelt way you rarely meet in other artists, or for that matter, in any other person today.

This is by no means strange, because as an artist, a creator of feelings Ali has learned from his experience in society and conveys it out of a pure heart in his personal art. In fact, it is very difficult for me to distinguish between him as a person and his artistic work.

RETROSPECTIVE OR PEDANTRY?

Between time to time the world of fine arts surprise us by some phenomena which one can consider it not art at all, what they want from us, why they want us to believe that our brains are smaller than what we think, they are very ironic to us, -one viewer in the salon said so.

The Helsinki City Art Museum hosting this season the very well known American artist "or that what they call his at least" Jeff Koons, which he considered one of the most important talented artists of the contemporary time.

Koons could create a new phenomenon in the world of visual art. That what Rem Koolhaas and Hans Ulrich Obris think in their interview with Jeff whom I read in the catalogue that appeared during the exhibition.

Koons show some works that are surprisingly inspiring many questions, about art and why we consider this type of works as art, but that by itself is one characteristic of the contemporary art.


EXHIBITION REVIEW

The works dose not inspire questions and puzzles, because they are sinking in the unknown and the abstract, but they are much simpler than anyone can imagine, they some times are closer to the handcraft, so the visitor to the exhibition do not know why they are artworks at all?

He, studded at the art school for many times, he worked in the purse market many time, but he was like any typical contemporary American citizen, who dreams of wealth and richness, or in other word the supreme. His main aim to enter the art world was the money, not creating a new phenomenon.

At the press conference before the opening Jeff declares that contemporary artists should go around 360 degrees to know what is surrounding them, because art cannot survive by itself only. That is may be right, but how? And when? He added, contemporary artist should know how to use the opportunities around him or her to support his or her artworks.

As a matter of fact, that it is not strange to any viewer or to whom who wants to know this artist through his works, which they are not his works basically, but he wants them to be his works. We would encounter a fair amount of resistance to the idea that Koons is anything more than a clever opportunist who has pulled the wool over the rest of the Art World's eye.

Then, Koons the creator of the opportunities, he dose not anything else than the opportunities in his life, even his intermarry to the really well know porn star Cicciolina Ilona staller is an opportunity to take him up. Science, message or any other "difficult word like these are not in his dictionary, just the opportunity and nothing else than opportunity.

Although that Arthur C.Danto tried in his article at the catalogue, to take Jeff up or to make some sense out of his works, compare him with Andy Warhol or Marcel Duchamp, or even the comparison that he made by himself to the Brook time artists, when he talked about himself at the press conference, dose not make any sense that he is an artist.

This falsifying gratitude to make an artist will not stay at the history, (or I may be mistaken, because the history made by this falsifications) but no, I do not believe that at all, I do not want to change my belief of the history of mankind, I want to remain faithful to the logic to the reason that we hear inside of us, not to the rationalization that some one do to convince us.

This man dose not recognize the dimensions of mankind, or better to say he dose not see them, he sees one dimension "how much you have


money, that much you worth" in this way as I believe he is like any ordinary one else, perhaps he will be happy to hear that, but I should admit that history has not been belt by pedants.

If some one wants to know if I am right or wrong, he/she must take any "artwork" of him, study how he find it, where and when he bought it, take for example Michael Jackson and Bubble has made by some other artist, but the idea was some one's else too.

The work is based on a found photo of the pop star with Bubble, his pet chimp, on his lap. The composition was first modeled in clay, a mould was taken and finally three ceramic copies of the sculpture were cast. To do the actual work, koons looked for the most highly skilled craftsman around; it was a move which took issue at the same time with a middle-class penchant to judge artistic merit on the basis of the craftsmanship. Koons himself undermined this point in part when he admitted that none of the work had been done by the master himself.

Or any one can take any piece of his work (see that I do not agree to call them Art) they are works, not art, take the Disney toys for example or ant thing that you want to see, you will find immediately that the person that others force us to accept as an artist is not artist at all, but he is a pure product of the market policy, nothing else than that.


PEETER MUDIST: THIRD RETRETTI WINTER EXHIBITION


So Dear Madam or Sir,
